
Trinity United Church Of Christ

Trinity United Church of Christ is seeking a pastor to serve its present active congregation and pursue the potential for growth that exists within the congregation and the community.



Trinity Church is located in downtown Greensburg, Pennsylvania about one block north of the Westmoreland County Courthouse. The meeting house was built in 1849. An office/education building was constructed in 1974.

Trinity has approximately 100 members with 45% of them 60 years of age or older. Average worship attendance is about 40. Our pastor retired in February, 2011 after more than 18 years of faithful service.

Greensburg is a city of about 15,000 located 35 miles east of Pittsburgh. South Greensburg and Southwest Greensburg are two small boroughs of 5,000 people each that are adjacent to the city. All three are

surrounded by Hempfield Township which contains about 50,000 people. The area has outstanding cultural, health,

and education facilities that include: Excela Health Westmoreland Hospital, Westmoreland Cultural Trust, Westmoreland Museum of Fine Arts, Westmoreland Choral Society, Westmoreland County Community College, Seton Hill University, University of Pittsburgh Branch, and Saint Vincent College.

Although small in numbers, Trinity United Church of Christ has always been a prominent part of the Greensburg community.

The pastor and members have actively participated in the Greensburg Ministerium; and they have extended our mission through: manning Salvation Army Kettles, helping Meals on Wheels, supporting Volunteer Firemen, providing Music Scholarships, Community Pancake Suppers, Church Camping Scholarships, and Low Cost Rummage Sales.

Our Main Street facilities are used by outside human services groups such as: YMCA Day Camp, Laurel Highland Harmony Singers, Golden Dome Knitting Guild, Alcoholics Anonymous, Laurel Highlands Searchers, and the Pittsburgh Aids Task Force. Trinity is also one of a few churches that operate food booths at the Westmoreland County Fair.
